**DRAFT BILL**

- **Project of decree that amends and adds provisions of the Credit Information Corporations Law**
  - Originated by Gustavo Fernando Caballero Camargo, representative of the parliamentary group of the PRI
  - Submitted to the Finance Commission.
    - **Synopsis: The main purpose of this bill is to protect people and entities from potential abuses of credit bureaus, as a consequence of certain debts.**

**DRAFT BILL**

- **Project of decree that promulgates the Importation and Exportation General Tax Law**
  - Originated by Felipe de Jesús Calderón Hinojosa, President of the United Mexican States.
  - Submitted to the Economy Commission.
    - **Synopsis: The main purpose of this bill is to maintain up to date -according to international standards- the tariff nomenclature used in international trade.**

**DRAFT BILL**

- **Project of decree that amends the Federal Economic Competition Law**
  - Originated by Alejandro Sánchez Camacho, representative of the parliamentary group of the PRD
  - Submitted to the Economy Commission.
    - **Synopsis: This bill aims to establish a system of fines that can effectively discourage monopolistic entities from performing activities that are against this law.**
